1	Travel	Communicate travel signs and concepts in ASL
2	States & Cities	Communicate the signs for various states and cities in ASL
3	Schools	Produce signs common in various school settings in ASL
4	Careers	Communicate signs and concepts common to careers
5	Facial Expressions	Produce signs for various emotions in ASL and analyze the significance of "Name Signs" in Deaf Culture.
6	ASL Grammar	Produce new vocabulary words, and numbers in ASL. Receptively identify instructors fingerspelled words.
7	ASL Sentences and Pronouns	Produce additional vocabulary words and articulate how Deaf people communicate in the dark.
8	Classifiers	Demonstrate new vocabulary words in ASL and articulate the culturally appropriate way to walk in-between two Deaf people signing to each other.
9	Verbs	Articulate culturally insensitive actions that a hearing person may make when interacting with Deaf people. Produce new vocabulary words and numbers
10	Describing a Room	Produce room descriptions in ASL

Born Deaf to Deaf parents and growing up with a Deaf sister, Dr. Byron W. Bridges has used ASL as the primary language throughout his whole life. He attended Deaf schools and public schools. Dr. Bridges earned his Bachelors of Arts degree in Deaf Studies at California State University of Northridge, Masters of Arts (MA) degree in Linguistics from Gallaudet University, and a doctoral degree (Ed.D) in Deaf Studies and Deaf Education at Lamar University.

Dr. Bridges co-authored the book, *Deaf Tend Your*. He has written video scripts and produced numerous sign language related videotapes/DVDs. He is a nationally-known teacher and lecturer in ASL and sign language interpretation. Dr. Bridges has been in the field of ASL linguistics, interpreting and post secondary teaching of ASL as a second language for over 30 years. He is a certified Deaf interpreter (CDI), earning the certification through the Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf.
